### The Nature of Crime

- A Crime is any act or omission of an act that is prohibited and punishable by federal statute
- Basically anything in the Canadian Criminal Code.
- Canadian Criminal Code



### **Omission**

Omission of an act means that some crimes are a result of failure to act in certain situations.



4 conditions must exist for an act or an omission to be considered a crime

1) The act is considered wrong by society.



2) The act causes harm to society in general or to those (such as minors) who need protection



### 3)The harm must be serious



# 4)The remedy must be handled by the criminal justice system



### Crime

### Canadian Criminal Code

- Contains the definition of all criminal offences, the sentences, and procedures for trial
- Parliament amends the code as society's values change
- Canadian Criminal Code



### **Provincial Jurisdiction**

Provincial Courts administer federal law

- Provinces control traffic and liquor laws
- Provincial or municipal laws are considered quasi criminal, which are less serious and usually involve a fine
