Why do we need to be good at reading?

- Reading helps us to
 - o improve our writing skills
 - o improve our vocabularies (without studying lists and definitions)
 - o improve our reading speed
 - o recall prior knowledge and build understanding of the world around us
 - o determine what is important
 - infer, predict, draw conclusions, make judgements, and form unique interpretations
 - o network new information with existing knowledge
 - o expand our imaginations
 - o problem solve
 - o improve our critical thinking skills

Rules of U.S.S.R.

- 1. Choose a book that interests you and that is at your reading level.
- 2. Once you have selected a book, stick with it.
- 3. Books should be at least 200 pages in length fiction or non-fiction (some exceptions may apply.)
- 4. You may not count textbook readings from other classes.
- 5. Manuals and magazines are not acceptable.
- 6. Bring your books to class every day or keep one in the classroom.
- 7. Once you complete a book, fill out a USSR form and hand it in.
