3. Approval of last CPAC Minutes

4. Administration Update

- Assessment week New block system is going well; some folks in learning services were finding it hard to find scribes and readers for all students at once
- Course Information Evening Thurs Feb 22, 5:00 8:30 pm; combined night for Meet the Teacher and Course Selection; Grade 8 parents come in early with counsellors and admin; offering a full-year competitive girls LaX next year!
- Vending Machines Staff Committee hasn't met yet but the issue will be addressed; they do
 bring in money, but the contents aren't healthy enough and the contractor won't accommodate
 us; contractor loads the machine in order to make more money, not aligned with Healthy
 Schools; we are looking into running our own machines but there's a cost associated with that
- Future Anti-Racism Student Conferences hasn't gotten ahold of Dr. G yet but will work on it; currently presenting at the tapestry conference for multiple districts;
- Daily News Update Andrea Martin coming back Jan 29! Her husband is still not doing well full time in hospital, but she will come back part time while he's there
- S.E.A.T. and the Accessible BC Act Saanich Equitable Access Team (13-14 people from our district, half of which are parents) who are looking at all schools to increase accessibility and decrease barriers and impairments; changes will start in the next school year

5. Executive Updates:

a. President's Report

- Spring Budget review of requests & voting in the Feb CPAC meeting; second round of budget discussions new requests will be reviewed at next exec meeting and then discussed and decided on at the next CPAC meeting; need to allocate the rest of the \$
- Mental Health speaker to be identified for Student Conferences; we are proactively doing a
 follow-up to the anti-racism talks from last year (maybe smaller student conferences) or perhaps
 a whole-school speaker to address mental health; exec will work on identifying speakers and
 bring recommendations to CPAC

- PAC Fundraiser planning efforts to be coordinated for a fundraiser initiative in Fall 2024; October/November is the only way the funds will have an impact on the school year, so we need to plan this in the next few months; new PAC exec will just need to execute the plan in the fall
- Daily News, Bi-weekly Principal communication feedback from parents that they want to hear from the school more often; this will be addressed by Andrea's return; parent grad committee is asking for help getting messages out and those can be sent out quickly as needed

- CPAC recently sent out communication on School Struggle Online Resources and invitation to submit nominations for awards
- Lots of info and opportunities; CPAC will comb through and prioritize what to share with our parent community
- <u>Childhood Unplugged</u> by Katherine Johnson Martinko would be a good thing to encourage parents to read/listen to in prep for the April 9 meeting maybe CPAC could fund giving away a few copies to folks who come to the meeting and maybe give an overview or some reviews to engage them; will see if it's applicable to HS students

6. Miscellaneous topics – open floor for questions from parents

- Marian would like to bring something up to COPAC: what do we do in a crisis? Especially with
 respect to communication to families in emergencies (for example, our recent snow storm);
 maybe we can get the district to think about this; Marian will send a write-up via email with
 specific examples and Stacy will share it with COPAC
- Stacy feels like maybe kids at the HS level are "walking around with empty buckets;" (from *Have You Filled A Bucket Today?: A Guide To Daily Happiness For Kids* by Carol McCloud); a lot of resource direction is going to issues such as racism and other compartmentalized situations and she's wondering if we're missing a mark by not teaching empathy more as a generalized value throughout society; are there resources out there for HS kids on this? Aaron talked about the school goal and action plan that contains acceptance and empathy; empathy is taught in a variety of ways and he'd be happy to talk about them; social media and phones are a part of this; Ontario just banned cell phones and the management team is still discussing doing this here to encourage face-to-face conversations
- We need to have a focus on recruiting members for the PAC; continue to send out notices to feeder communities to encourage people to join; desperately need a treasurer maybe someone has a personal connection with a previous treasurer from one of the feeder schools? Marian will reach out to ROMSPAC; need to send out an announcement in the Daily News Update; we need to find people by May meeting; need to demystify the positions and expectations for people with no experience can we put together a one-pager? Can we speak at the parent night? Perhaps the document exists or we can draft a new one; Jennifer will be happy to take a look
- We delivered a welcome back gift for Andrea Martin
