4. COPACS Update – Stacey Finer

- Mtg was held on April 11. Stacey will represent our PAC at the BC Confederation of PACs (BCCPAC)
 AGM in May in Richmond.
- COPACS committees need members. See website. May 8 SOGI session planned. May 14 Parents Advocacy session planned.
- School Accident Policy: This policy will be clarified to ensure that families understand the procedures
 for injuries that occur at school. Principals will lead the injury response process, though they are not
 first aid trained. Other staff on site have WorksSafe BC training in first aid and will be involved in any
 injuries. Note that emergency contact shared by families on district paperwork each fall are not for
 contact in emergencies or for making health care decisions for students, but for contact only if parents
 cannot be reached.
- **Budget:** Mtg on March 15. No funding provided to cover for inflation, resulting in a \$900,000 shortfall next year (1% of the budget). No cuts next years, but will appear in 2025/26 year and likely will impact crossing guards, transportation and inclusionary programs. Details to follow in future.
- Budget survey to families is open until April 29.
- Budget meeting on April 17 at Bayside Middle School

5. Tour of Robotics Classroom and Club – Mr. Paananen + students
