School Goal Statement: To improve students' motivation and interest in their own learning.

1. Rationale:

- a. Current student perception is far below the National Mean.
- b. Curriculum changes for the new Grad program will provide an opportunity for students to personally invest in their own learning.

2. Strategies:

a. Taking Action:

- i. Scheduled use of collaboration time by departments to track successes and recommend improvements to curriculum changes.
- ii. Develop a process engaging students in Home Room that will help students better recognize their levels of interest and sense of motivation.
- iii. Seek input from students for strategies to improve their interest and motivation in order to personalize their learning.

b. Checking/Results:

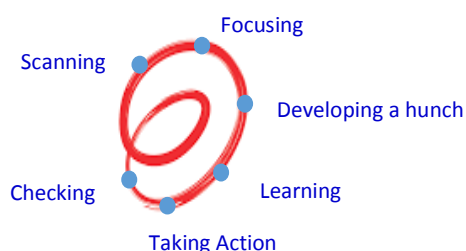
- i. TAC (Teacher Advisory Council) will have a monthly check-in with department and student progress.

Six-Year Completion Rate - The proportion of students who graduate, with a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation or British Columbia Adult Graduation Diploma, within six years from the first time they enrol in Grade 8, adjusted for migration in and out of British Columbia.
