Dear Parents, Guardians and Students.

Here are some important information items as we work through the final month of school.

<u>New - Indigenious Course Required for 2024 Grads:</u> The Minister of Education in collaboration with the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) was pleased to announce that as part of the Province's commitments to truth, reconciliation, and anti-racism, the Ministry of Education is implementing an Indigenous-focused graduation requirement for all students. Saanich schools are fully supportive of the BC Ministry of Education's direction to introduce a mandatory graduation requirement focusing on Indigenous content starting with the 2024 graduation year.

Next year, at Claremont, we will offer English First Peoples 11 to all grade 11 students. This course will fully meet the requirement. Grade 11 students also have the option to take English First Peoples 12 in their grade 12 year, or First Nations Studies 12 in their grades 11 or 12 year to meet this requirement.

We are excited about the opportunities these courses will provide all students. In future, we hope to offer more course options with Indigenous focus. If students would like to change their schedule for 2022-23, please contact a school counsellor asap.

<u>Literacy & Numeracy Assessments</u>: Coming up on June 15th and 16th, we will be running the Provincial Literacy and Numeracy Assessments. The focus of this session is to have students in the following circumstances write: grade 10s currently in English 10, grade 10s currently in Workplace Math 10, grade 10s who missed Numeracy 10 in the November, grade 11s who are missing either Literacy 10 or Numeracy 10, and grade 12s missing any of the three assessments (Lit. 10/12 & Num. 10). During these two days, we will be running a Copernican schedule (2 long blocks per day) to accommodate the 3 hours required to write the assessment. *Students not attached to an English 10 or Workplace Math 10 class will have to sign-up to write the exam, sign-up starts Monday, June 6th with Ms. Watson in room 222.* Please check with your student to see if they have to write and if they are required to sign-up.
